In furtherance of this important program, on January 23, 2020 the BCUA Commissioners adopted a resolution extending its existing solid waste disposal contract with Covanta Sustainable Solutions, LLC for an additional year commencing June 1, 2020 terminating May 31, 2021. The per ton cost for the one year extension of the BCUA Solid Waste Cooperative Marketing Program has increased from \$66.39 to \$69.05 per ton inclusive of the \$3.00 per ton recycling tax.

FIRST AMENDMENT TO SOLID WASTE SERVICE AGREEMENT

dated Service Agreement Solid Waste This First Amendment to 2020 (the "Amendment Agreement"), by and between the Bergen County Utilities Authority, a public body politic and corporate of the State of New Jersey, having its principal offices for the performance of essential governmental functions and services located at the Foot of Mehrhof Road, Little Ferry, New Jersey 07643 (hereinafter referred to as the "Authority"), and the Borough of Bergenfield, a municipal corporation of the State of New Jersey, having its principal offices for the performance of essential governmental functions and services located at 198 North Washington Avenue, Bergenfield, New Jersey 07621 (hereinafter referred to as the "Municipality").

WHEREAS, by Resolution 18-6-005 adopted April 26, 2018, the Board of Commissioners of the Authority (hereinafter referred to as the "Board" or the "Commissioners") awarded Authority Contract No. 18-04, for the acceptance, processing and disposal of municipal solid waste, to Covanta Sustainable Solutions, LLC for a contract term of two (2) years and with the Authority being given the option of extending that contract term for an additional one year (1) period; and

WHEREAS, while the initial two (2) year contract term of Contract No. 18-04 expires May 31, 2020, the Authority has the option to extend the term of Contract No. 18-04 for an additional one (1) year period; and

WHEREAS, by Resolution 20-6-001 adopted at the January 23, 2020 Regular Meeting of the Board, the Commissioners of the Authority formally exercised the Authority's right to extend the contract term of Contract No. 18-04 for an initial one (1) year period (commencing June 1, 2020 and expiring May 31, 2021); and

WHEREAS, on May 31, 2018 the Authority and the Municipality entered into a Solid Waste Service Agreement (the "Service Agreement") for the processing, transportation and disposal of solid waste generated from within the Municipality; and

WHEREAS, the Service Agreement terminates on May 31, 2020, which date is also the expiration date of the initial two (2) year contract term of Authority Contract No. 18-04; and

WHEREAS, by Resolution 20-6-002 adopted at the January 23, 2020 Regular Meeting of the Board, the Commissioners of the Authority authorized the execution of this Amendment Agreement extending the term of the Service Agreement for an initial one (1) year period (commencing June 1, 2020 and expiring May 31, 2021), to run co-terminous with Authority Contract No. 18-04 as amended by Resolution 20-6-001; and

WHEREAS, both the Municipality and the Authority wish to extend the Service Agreement for an additional one (1) year term, at a revised rate, so that the term of the Service Agreement runs co-terminous with Authority Contract No. 18-04 with Covanta Sustainable Solutions, LLC; and

WHEREAS, this Amendment Agreement is now being entered into as authorized by Resolution 20-6-002 for the purpose of amending the Service Agreement previously entered into by and between the Authority and the Municipality.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and promises contained herein, the parties hereto agree as follows:

- 1. Section III, Subsection 3.02 of the Service Agreement shall be amended, with the rate being increased from \$66.39 per ton to \$69.05 per ton, and Section III, Subsection 3.02 of the Service Agreement shall now provide as follows:
 - "3.02. During the term of this Service Agreement, the Municipality shall be billed by the BCUA on a monthly basis at the following rate for each ton of solid

waste delivered to the Transfer Station Facility by or on behalf of the Municipality:

June 1, 2020 through May 31, 2021 \$ 69.05 per ton

During the term of this Service Agreement, the Municipality shall pay the BCUA within thirty (30) days of the date of each invoice. A late fee equal to 1% of the unpaid balance shall be charged for every thirty (30) days the balance of the invoice or a portion thereof remains unpaid. The late fee shall be charged commencing five (5) days subsequent to the due date. Failure on the part of the Municipality to pay all or any amount required to be paid to the BCUA under this Service Agreement pursuant to this section 3.02 shall constitute and Event of Default."

2. Section VII, Subsection 7.01 of the Service Agreement shall be amended, with the term of the Service Agreement being extended for a one (1) year period, commencing June 1, 2020 and expiring May 31, 2021, which term represents a one (1) year extension of the Service Agreement causing the term of the Service Agreement to be co-terminous with the term of Authority Contract No. 18-04 as amended by Resolution 20-6-001, and Section VII, Subsection 7.01 of the Service Agreement shall now provide as follows:

7.01 The term of this Service Agreement shall be for a term of one (1) year, commencing June 1, 2020 and terminating May 31, 2021.

- All other terms and conditions of the Service Agreement shall remain in full force and effect except as amended herein.
- 4. This Amendment Agreement may not be amended or modified without the express written consent of the parties hereto.

5. This Amendment Agreement shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the State of New Jersey, without any consideration being given to any principle or choice or conflict of law.

REMINGTON & VERNICK ENGINEERS (RVE) is pleased to present this proposal to perform tax map maintenance services for the Borough of Bergenfield for tax year 2020. All updates will be completed and submitted to the Bergen County Board of Taxation no later than January 2021.

SCOPE OF SERVICES

RVE will perform the entire scope of services outlined herein to update and maintain the Borough's manual tax maps for the 2020 tax year.

A. 2020 Tax Map Updates and Revisions

RVE will require copies of the following tax map resource data for the Borough of Bergenfield prior to the commencement of this project:

- State approved tax maps (on file with our firm)
- Current MOD IV tax assessment database as tab-delimited text, in both electronic (if available) and hardcopy formats, as applicable (to be provided by the Bergenfield Tax Assessor)
- List of updates/revisions needed (provided by the Bergenfield Tax Assessor)
- Associated deeds and approved file plans (provided by the Bergenfield Tax Assessor)

We will complete any / all changes to be provided by the Tax Assessor's office for 2020. These may include dimensions, deed discrepancies, acreages, ownership, major / minor subdivisions, lot consolidations and similar adjustments, as well as the addition of any new development to the tax maps. Deeds will be protracted, calculated and reviewed for closure as needed.

Any additional work not outlined in this proposal may be requested by the Tax Assessor or the Borough of Bergenfield on an as-needed basis throughout the course of 2020. RVE will be pleased to provide a separate cost proposal for any / all additional services the Borough may need.

B. Final Tax Map Deliverables

RVE will maintain the original copy of the Borough's manual tax map set on file. The following final copies of the 2020 updated tax maps will be delivered upon completion of the requested updates (no later than January 2021):

- Two (2) sets of 24" x 36" tax maps, bound, in black/white on bond paper
- One (1) sets of 12" x 18" tax maps, bound, in black/white on bond paper
- One (1) sets of 11" x 17" tax maps, unbound, in black/white on bond paper
- One (1) accessible ShareFile link containing all correspondence and printable PDF copies of each tax map - individual plates will be hyperlinked to their corresponding Key Map for ease of location and use

Appropriate copies will also be provided to the Bergen County Board of Taxation no later than January 2021, or as directed by the Tax Assessor.

C. Tax Map Viewer-(Added Value at No Additional Cost)

RVE will also be able to complement our traditional physical copies of our Tax Map deliverables with a new Tax Map viewer site. The Tax Map Viewer allows users the ability to search and download or print the current tax map plates for Bergenfield Borough. The site will give users the ability to search by block & lot, by street address or by tax map plate number and bring up the corresponding tax map plate. These search capabilities are based on the updated parcels in GIS, which are linked to the tax map plates stored for easy access on the cloud (AWS).

Users can quickly see completed tax map changes and gain access to a variety of data, including full tax map books. The website will allow not only the members of the tax assessors department access to digital tax maps, but also the public. By allowing open access to the tax maps, there will less burden on the assessors for tax map related OPRA requests.

COST OF SERVICES

The total estimated cost for the completion of the 2020 tax map updates, as outlined in our scope of services, will be a time and material, not to exceed figure of \$2,500.00. Revisions will be completed as directed during the course of 2020.

\$2,500.00 cap has been reached, RVE will provide notice in writing to the Borough Administrator and Tax Assessor of the additional costs needed to complete said work. RVE will not proceed with any additional work that will exceed the \$2,500.00 cap without prior written authorization from the Borough Governing Body. All work will be completed on an hourly basis at our current Bergenfield Borough contract rates. Any portion of the allocated \$2,500.00 budget that is not used for requested maintenance work during 2020 may be applied to future maintenance work for 2021, or as otherwise directed by the Borough. All work will be billed at our current Bergenfield Borough contract rates. A dedicated project number will be established for billing purposes.

Scope and Fee Estimate for Engineering Services

Dear Mr. Gallo:

T&M Associates is pleased to present this Proposal for Professional Services related for the Twin Boro Field Improvements, Phase I Project. This proposal contains our understanding of the project, specific scope of services, schedule and fee summary.

PROJECT UNDERSTANDING

The preliminary construction cost for the project has been estimated to be \$3,150,000.

The scope of the improvements will include the following as well as shown on the attached Concept plan:

- Installation of two (2) soccer synthetic turf fields along with associated drainage improvements.
- · Sports lighting.
- Team benches, bleachers and handicap seating.
- Walkways and handicap accessible parking area.
- · Fencing, gates and ball safety netting
- Demolition of the existing restroom structure.
- Regrading of the site and installation of retaining walls, as necessary.
- Topsoil, fertilize and seed areas of disturbance.
- Restoration and cleanup.

SCOPE OF SERVICES

In order to accomplish the Borough's objectives, T&M proposes the following scope of services:

Task I: Field Survey

- a. Obtain topographic survey by conventional "on the ground" methods. The survey will be based on NAD83 and NAVD88 and will include locations of physical features.
- b. Establish an open random traverse. Swing tie the end traverse points. Set benchmarks outside the limits of work for vertical control during construction.
- c. Verify existing topographic features including curbs, sidewalk, pavement areas, trees, signs, fences, wooded areas, drainage systems and utilities including catch basins, manholes, fire hydrants and valve boxes.

- d. Locate all visible utilities and record pole numbers, sump pump outlets and provide inverts, pipe sizes and types of pipes of the drainage and sanitary structures.
- e. Utilizing the field data collected, prepare a basemap of the existing features to be utilized to complete the design of the improvements.

Task II: Funding Agency Coordination

a. Administrate and coordinate the necessary documentation with the NJDEP Green Acres Program.

Task III: Design

- a. Coordinate and conduct a project kickoff meeting with the Borough to review the scope of work, obtain any existing information and establish a project schedule. Prepare and distribute meeting minutes.
- b. Coordinate and conduct progress meetings with Borough representatives to review the design at various stages of development. Prepare and distribute meeting minutes.
- c. Prepare fully engineered construction plans, cost estimates and specifications necessary to construct the project including site layout, grading, drainage, lighting and landscaping design. The construction plans are anticipated to include the following:
 - Cover Sheet with Key Map;
 - · Distribution of Quantities;
 - General Notes and Legend Sheet;
 - Existing Conditions and Removal Plan;
 - Construction and Layout Plan;
 - Grading, Drainage and Soil Erosion and Sediment Control Plan;
 - Lighting and Electrical Plan;
 - Landscape Plan;
 - Construction Details Plan;
 - Maintenance and Protection of Traffic Plan; and
 - Soil Erosion and Sediment Control Notes and Details Sheets.
- d. Design drainage improvements since the proposed construction of the subject synthetic turf fields will result in an increase in impervious cover in excess of 0.25 acres and a limit of disturbance in excess of 1.0-acre, both of which exceed the thresholds requiring adherence to the NJDEP Stormwater Management Rules at NJAC 7:8. Therefore, the field will be designed to meet the stormwater quantity, quality and recharge requirements of NJAC 7:8, as described below:
 - 1. To address NJDEP criteria for stormwater quantity impacts, we will design a detention facility beneath the field consisting of a perforated pipe and gravel bedding drainage system underlying the field, which will be sized to attenuate discharges for the 2, 10, 25 and 100-year events. An outlet control structure will be designed as part of the proposed detention facility. It is anticipated that the proposed system will discharge to the existing municipal stormwater management system, however, this cannot be determined until survey is obtained

and preliminary design calculations performed. As it is anticipated that the system will discharge to the municipal system and that an outfall into a State regulated water will not be required, NJDEP permitting is excluded from this scope.

- 2. Addressing water quality requirements will not be necessary as runoff from surfaces such as athletic fields and tracks is considered clean.
- 3. We anticipate addressing the groundwater recharge requirements to the greatest degree possible through the use of the underground stormwater basin noted above. The rates of recharge will be dependent upon the permeability of the underlying soil as determined by soil testing, as described below. We will complete the NJDEP GSR-32 spreadsheet to determine the annual recharge amounts.
- e. In order to confirm the subsurface characteristics of the onsite soils per NJDEP requirements, test pits will be required to determine soil permeability rates and the depth to seasonal high groundwater, as per the Soil Testing Criteria found at Appendix E of the NJ Stormwater BMP Manual. At this time, we anticipate approximately two (2) additional test pits to be performed within the footprint of the proposed field location.
- f. Quantities will be estimated by item, and a final construction cost estimate will be provided.
- g. Specifications will be prepared in book form, in T&M Associates' format, based on the 2019 New Jersey Department of Transportation Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction.
- h. Submit plans and specifications to the Borough for final review and approval.

Task IV: Permit Preparation

- a. Conduct field work to delineate the extent of the wetlands on the property and near the project area. The freshwater wetlands within the project limits will be delineated pursuant to the <u>Federal Manual for Identifying and Delineating Jurisdictional Wetlands (1989)</u>, the method currently accepted by the NJDEP Land Use Regulation Program. The resultant wetland delineation will be located and plotted on available NJDEP aerial mapping or property survey using Global Positioning System (GPS) equipment. Upon completion of the wetland delineation, T&M will determine the limit of disturbance and review the required NJDEP Permit Applications.
- b. If it is determined that the proposed project will result in the disturbance to wetlands and/or wetland buffers a Freshwater Wetland Permit would be required as regulated by the Freshwater Wetland Protection Act Rules (NJAC 7:7A). Depending on the total amount of disturbance to regulated wetlands and wetland buffer, a Freshwater Wetland General Permit or Transition Area Waiver would be required. The Freshwater Wetlands Permit Application will include an Environmental Impact Report and compliance statement, fully executed DLUR Form, wetland delineation data logs, site location maps, color photographs, public notice documentation to all property owners within 200 feet, and five (5) sets of signed and sealed design plans.

c. An application for soil erosion and sediment control certification will be prepared and submitted by T&M Associates to the Soil Conservation District on behalf of the Borough. The permit fee will be prepared and will be requested from the Borough when the permit application is submitted.

Task V: Bidding

- a. Prospective bidders will be directed to pick-up plans & specifications from T&M's Bloomfield office. Plans and specifications will be reproduced, and printing costs will be offset by the purchase price of the plans and specifications. In addition, the Borough will be provided with a set of plans and specifications.
- b. Answer questions that arise during the bidding phase of the project, either from Borough Officials or prospective bidders.
- c. Attend the receipt of bids with the appropriate Borough officials.
- d. Assist the Borough with the bid review process including an evaluation of the contractors' bid submissions. T&M will prepare a bid tabulation sheet comparing the various bids received, review the credentials of the prospective contractors, and prepare a recommendation for award.

Task VI: Contract Administration & Inspection

T&M will provide a part-time Project Manager and a part-time Inspector with additional support services from our office staff, as directed by the Project Manager. In addition, the Project Manager and Inspector will coordinate with the Borough and Contractor. The Inspector will be responsible to observe construction in an effort to determine if the work is installed in general accordance with the design plans and standard construction practices. The following is a description of the services we will provide:

- a. Conduct a pre-construction meeting among the project participants, including the contractor, Borough officials and utility representatives, and produce minutes of this meeting. Coordinate and review initial project submittals, including contract package, performance bond, insurance certificate, baseline project schedule, emergency contact lists, etc. Prepare for contractor mobilization.
- b. Administrate and review contractor submittals, including schedules, shop drawings, product data and samples and material certifications for general conformance with Contract Documents.
- c. Provide an inspector to conduct site visits to determine general conformance to the contract plans and specifications.
- d. Review Contractor's monthly estimates of work performed, and invoices submitted for payment, and make recommendations to the Borough for payment. Prepare monthly estimates of payment to the Contractor.
- e. Perform final inspection. Prepare and administer corrective action lists and prepare final closeout documents, including Final Payment Certificate and Change Order.

- f. Administrate documentation for the grant program including reimbursement requests, contractor submittals and closeout documents.
- g. Prepare final closeout package, including Maintenance Bond, Releases, Final Payment Certificate and Change Order and coordinate Engineer's and Owner's execution of closeout documents.

If the Contractor does not reach substantial completion of the work by the time set forth in the contract, and our budget for contract administration and inspection services prior to substantial completion is fully expended, we will ask the Borough to enforce provisions of the contract allowing the Borough to deduct payment to the Contractor in order to pay for continued engineering services. Similarly, should our services be required on weekends, we will also ask the Borough to enforce provisions of the contract allowing the Borough to deduct payment to the Contractor in order to pay for the excess hours. AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT, made this ______ day of _____, 2020 between the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Bergenfield, a body corporate of the State of New Jersey with its offices located at 198 N. Washington Avenue, Bergenfield, Bergen County, New Jersey, party of the first part (hereinafter referred to as the "Borough") represented by Mayor Arvin Amatorio, hereto fully authorized to act by virtue of Resolution No. 20— passed by the Governing Body on April 21, 2020 and 11 Enviro Group LLC, with its principal place of business at 167 W. 73rd Street, New York, New York 10023, party of the second part (hereinafter referred to as the "Contractor").

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council have appropriated the necessary funds to undertake the West Clinton Avenue and Melrose Avenue Storm Sewer Cleaning and Video Inspection in accordance with the proposal submitted; and

WHEREAS, the Contractor has offered to provide West Clinton Avenue and Melrose Avenue Storm Sewer Cleaning and Video Inspection to the Borough at a cost of \$18,396.86 in accord with the proposal submitted by the Contractor attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference; and

WHEREAS, the Contractor shall commence the Storm Sewer Cleaning and Video Inspection of West Clinton Avenue and Melrose Avenue within ten (10) days of the signing of this Agreement; and

WHEREAS, Borough has considered the proposal, the qualifications of the Contractor and has found the Contractor to be responsible and the proposal to be fair.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the terms and conditions, covenants and promises hereinafter contained, and pursuant to the laws of the State of New Jersey applicable hereto and incorporated herein by reference the respective parties do hereby mutually agree as follows:

- (1) The Contractor shall and does agree to provide the Storm Sewer Cleaning and Video Inspection of West Clinton Avenue and Melrose Avenue as shown and/or specified on the proposal on file in the Borough Engineer's office at a cost of \$18,396.86; and
- (2) The Contractor agrees to provide the Storm Sewer Cleaning and Video Inspection of West Clinton Avenue and Melrose Avenue to the Borough of Bergenfield upon the signing of this contract; and
- (3) In addition to all the other terms and conditions of the contract documents attached hereto and made a part hereof, in the event the Storm Sewer Cleaning and Video Inspection of West Clinton Avenue and Melrose Avenue agreed to be provided by the Contractor is not provided within ten (10) days of the signing of this Agreement, due to the fault on the part of the Contractor, the Borough has a right to void this Agreement.
- (4) It is agreed that in the event the Contractor shall become insolvent, make an assignment for the benefit of creditors, be adjudicated a bankrupt or insolvent or take proceedings for liquidation by arrangement or composition with creditors, either voluntarily or

involuntarily, any of said acts may be considered a violation of this contract at the election of the Borough.

- (5) The Contractor shall receive full payment within 30 days of providing the Storm Sewer Cleaning and Video Inspection of West Clinton Avenue and Melrose Avenue provided the Contractor has submitted the appropriate invoice to the Borough.
- (6) Contractor will not be responsible or liable for occurrences beyond their control, nor for any contingency because of strikes or accidents.
- (7) The Contractor shall not assign, transfer, or otherwise dispose of this Agreement other than as is herein specified.
- (8) The Contractor represents and warrants to the Borough in order to induce the Borough to enter into this Agreement, the following:
- (a) The Contractor is able to provide the Storm Sewer Cleaning and Video Inspection of West Clinton Avenue and Melrose Avenue in accord with the Contractor's Proposal; and
- (b) That the facts stated in any written material or proposal provided by the Contractor are true and correct in all respects.
- (9) The Contractor shall take out and maintain during the life of the contract, all insurances required by the Borough. The required Comprehensive General Liability Policy shall name the Borough, its officers and employees as additional named insureds.
- (10) The Contractor agrees to save, protect, indemnify and defend and hold the Borough harmless against any and all claims, liens or demands made by any person, firm or corporation for any personal injury or property damage occasioned by the within Agreement or alleged to be caused thereunder by reason of any act on the Contractor's part or any breach of contract or otherwise arising or alleged to be arising out of this Agreement, and further agrees to indemnify, defend, protect and save harmless the Borough from any claim or demand for patent fees, royalties or any invention, machine, article or arrangement that may be used by the Contractor in the performance of the work, and further agrees to defend any and all actions and proceedings arising out of any of the foregoing claims in any suit, and to pay counsel fees and expenses of all kinds whatsoever in any connection therewith.
- (11) There shall be no deviations, alterations or changes from this contract unless such deviations, alterations or changes are in writing, signed by both parties hereto, which writing shall specify the additional or lessor cost of same, if any.
- (12) This contract is further expressly subject to the provisions of law pertaining thereto, which said provisions are specifically incorporated herein by reference.
- (13) Reference herein to the contract documents is for the purpose of expressing the intention of the parties hereto and no conflict is intended to exist as between this instrument and the aforementioned contract documents, however, if any conflict should exist, the interpretations most favorable to the Borough shall be considered as governing the relationship between the parties hereto and

the interpretation as to which is most favorable shall be made by the Borough.

- (14) Federal Labor Standard Provisions, Executive Order No. 11246 and the Federal Wage Determination are hereby incorporated and made part of this contract.
- (15) During the performance of this contract, the contractor agrees as follows:
- (a) The contractor and subcontractor, where applicable, will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of age, race, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status or The contractor will take affirmative action to ensure that such applicants are recruited and employed, and that employees are treated during employment, without regard to their age, race, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status or affectional or sexual orientation. Such action shall include, but not be limited to the following: employment, upgrading, demotion or transfer; recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other compensation; and selection for training, including forms apprenticeship. The contractor agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices to be provided by the Public Agency Compliance Officer setting forth provisions of this nondiscrimination clause;
- (b) The contractor or subcontractor, where applicable will, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the contractor, state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to age, race, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status or sex;
- (c) The contractor or subcontractor, where applicable, will send to each labor union or representative or workers with which it has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract or understanding, a notice, to be provided by the agency contracting officer advising the labor union or workers' representative of the contractor's commitments under this act and shall post copies of the notice in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment.
- (d) The contractor or subcontractor, where applicable, agrees to comply with the regulations promulgated by the Treasurer pursuant to P.L. 1975, c. 127, as amended and supplemented from time to time.
- (e) The Contractor shall comply with any and all applicable State and Federal affirmative action laws and regulations.
- (16) The Borough may, at any time, terminate the Contract with or without cause.

<u>AGREEMENT</u>

PREAMBLE

THIS AGREEMENT, made this _____ day of _______, 2020, by and between the BOROUGH OF BERGENFIELD, a body politic and corporate of the State of New Jersey, hereafter referred to as "The Employer," and KENT CHRISTNER, hereinafter referred to as the "The Employee."

WHIMEAS, the Employer and the Employee recognize that it will be to the benefit of both to promote mutual understanding and foster a harmonious relationship between the parties to the end that continuous and efficient service will be rendered to and by both parties,

NOW THIMEAFTER, it is agreed as follows:

PRESERVATION OF RIGHTS

The Employer hereby retains and reserves unto itself all powers, rights, authority, duties and responsibilities conferred upon and vested in it prior to the signing of the Agreement by the Laws and Constitution of the State of New Jersey, including, but without limiting the generality of the foregoing, the following rights:

- (a) To the executive management and administrative control of the Employer Government and its properties and facilities.
- (b) To hire all employees, and subject to the provisions of law, to determine their qualifications and conditions for continued employment or assignment and to promote employees
- (c) To suspend, promote, demote, transfer, assign, reassign, discharge, or take any other disciplinary action in accordance with law.

STATUS AND DUTIES

The Employer and the Employee hereby agree that the Employee is a "Managerial Executive" and "Executive Employee" for the purposes of N.J.S.A. 34:13A-1 et seq, as amended, the New Jersey Public Employer-Employee relations Act and 29 USC Section 213, the United States Fair Labor Standards Act, respectively and companion or similar statutes and regulations. The Employee shall devote himself full-time to carrying out the duties of his office and position as Deputy Chief Financial Officer subject to review and approval of the Mayor and Council in accordance with the Local Government Supervision Act (1947) 1947 N.J. Laws ch. 151 (C. 52:27BB-1 et seq.); the Local Budge Law (N.J.S.A. 40A:4-1 et seq.); the Local Fiscal Affairs Law (N.J.S.A. 40A:5-1 et seq.); the Local Public Contracts Law 1971 N.J. Laws ch. 198 (C. 40A:11-1 et seq.) and other statutes, and such rules and regulations promulgated by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services, the Local Finance Board, or any other State agency, as may pertain to the financial administration of the municipality and shall devote his best efforts to the accomplishment of his duties and the mission of the Borough of Bergenfield. Nothing contained herein shall prevent the Employee from engaging in any outside activities which do not, in the opinion of the Mayor and Council, unreasonably interfere with his duties as Employee. The Employee shall at all times present a professional demeanor and without prejudice, malice or unlawful discrimination, carry out his duties as the Deputy Chief Financial Officer. Prior to engaging in outside employment, the employee will provide the Mayor and Council with all details of any such potential outside employment including, but not limited to, the days and hours of such potential outside employment, a description of the duties and responsibilities of such potential outside employment and the identity of the potential employer. The employee shall not commence any such outside employment until he received prior written consent and approval of the Mayor and Council. Denial of such approval shall be nonappealable.

INSURANCE AND BENEFITS

The Borough will provide full family medical coverage through the State Health Benefits Plan (SHBP) to Employee and his eligible dependents for as long as he is an active employee with the Borough of Bergenfield.

The Borough will provide a full family prescription plan to Employee and his eligible dependents for as long as he is an active employee with the Borough of Bergenfield. The

provisions of the prescription plan shall be administered through the New Jersey State Health Benefits Plan (SHBP). Any changes to co-pays/coverages, etc. to said plan made by the State Health Benefits Commission (SHBC) shall govern Employee with regard to such benefit. There shall be no stand-alone prescription plan.

The Borough will provide a full family dental benefit plan to the Employee and his eligible dependents for as long as he is an active employee with the Borough of Bergenfield.

The Borough reserves the right to change the provider(s) of the medical, dental and prescription coverage(s) provided as long as the coverage is substantially equivalent to existing coverage. The medical, dental and prescription coverage provided to the Employee under this agreement shall be the same coverage provided to other active Borough employees.

Medical, dental and prescription coverage will be provided to Employee and his eligible dependents upon retirement from the Borough of Bergenfield only upon completion of a minimum twenty-five (25) years of service with the Borough of Bergenfield and only until he is eligible to receive Medicare/Medicaid benefits.

The Employee shall contribute toward the cost of health insurance benefits pursuant to the provisions of CH. 78, P.L. 2011.

SALARY & TERM

The term of this agreement shall be for a period of three (3) years commencing January 1, 2020. For the period commencing January 1, 2020 through December 31, 2020, the employee shall be paid \$84,975.00. The employee's salary shall be increased on January 1, 2021 through December 31, 2021 to \$89,975.00 and increased again January 1, 2022 to December 31, 2022 to \$94,975.00. Upon execution of this agreement, the above stated salaries represent all monies due and owing from the Borough to the Employee.

OVERTIME

As the Employee is a "Managerial Executive" and "Executive Employee" for the purposes of N.J.S.A. 34:13A-1 et seq, as amended, the New Jersey Public Employer-Employee relations Act and 29 USC Section 213, the United States Fair Labor Standards Act, respectively and companion or similar statutes and regulations, there shall be no overtime pay.

LONGEVITY

There shall be no longevity pay.

VACATION

The Employee shall receive annual vacation leave of 20 days. Unused vacation days up to a maximum 10 days may only be carried over for use in the following year. Vacation days in excess of 10 days still unused after the second year will be forfeited. Vacation days not used because the request for use was denied due to the pressure of Municipal business will not be forfeit and are subject to approval by the Borough Administrator.

PERSONAL DAYS

The Employee shall receive three (3) personal days Personal days must be used within the year they accrue. Unused personal days will not be carried over, they will be forfeited.

SICK LEAVE

The Employee shall be entitled to one (1) sick leave day per month or twelve (12) sick leave days per calendar year (accrued at the rate of one day per month). Sick leave is to be used only in cases where the employee is unable to work due to illness, or in cases of serious illness of an immediate family member. A list of people considered to be "Immediate Family Members" can be found in the Sick Leave Policy contained in Section Three of the Borough of Bergenfield Personnel Policies and Procedures Manual dated April, 2012.

The Employee shall submit, upon his return to work, a doctor's verification of illness or injury when absent on sick leave for five (5) or more consecutive days. If the employee is absent to attend to an immediate family member, a doctor's verification of that individual's illness, injury or condition is required. Abuse of Sick Leave can be grounds for disciplinary action, up to and including termination of employment.

There shall be no payment for any unused sick time.

BERAEVEMENT LEAVE

The Employee is entitled to three (3) consecutive calendar days leave of absence for the death of the employee's immediate family member. A list of people considered to be "Immediate Family Members" can be found in the Sick Leave Policy, Section Three of the Borough of Bergenfield Personnel Policies and Procedures Manual dated September 2016. Employees who wish to attend the funeral of other friends, relatives, acquaintances and/or associates must request vacation or personal time off which is subject to the final determination of the Borough Administrator or his designee.

TERMINAL LEAVE

Upon termination of employment with the Borough, the employee having attained fifteen (15) years of service with the Borough will be entitled to receive severance pay which will be equal to three (3) months or \$15,000.00, whichever is less.

TRAINING & EDUCATION

The Deputy Chief Financial Officer will be allowed to attend any training classes or training conferences related to his Deputy Chief Financial Officer's certification at the Borough's sole expense.

GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE

Any formal dispute concerning the interpretation, application and enforcement of this agreement must be presented to the Borough Administrator or his designee within five (5) working days of the grievance arising. Failure to present a grievance within the time period shall be deemed a waiver of the grievance. The Borough Administrator or his designee will render a written decision to the Employee within five (5) workdays of the receipt of the written grievance. Failure of the Borough Administrator or his designee to respond within said (5) workday period shall constitute a denial of the grievance.

GOVERNING LAW

The terms of performance under this Agreement shall be subordinate to and governed by the laws of the State of New Jersey.

ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This instrument contains the entire Agreement of the parties respecting the employment of the Deputy Chief Financial Officer, and there are no representations, warranties, or commitments, except as set forth herein. This Agreement may be amended only by an instrument in writing executed by the parties hereto.

HEADINGS

Sections and other headings contained in this Employment Agreement are for reference purposes only and shall not affect in any way the meaning or interpretation of this agreement.

SAVINGS CLAUSE

Should any valid federal or state law or final determination of any court or administrative agency affect any provision of this Agreement, the provision or provisions so affected shall be automatically conformed to the law or determination and otherwise the Agreement shall continue in full force and effect. Nothing contained in this agreement is intended and shall not be construed as a waiver of any right or benefit to which the Deputy Chief Financial Officer or the Employer may be entitled to by law.

WAIVER OR BREACH

EMPLOYEE

The failure of either party to require the performance of any term or condition of this Agreement shall not prevent a subsequent enforcement of any such term or be deemed to be a waiver of any subsequent breach. The non-breaching party shall not be deemed to have waived any breach of the other party nor any of the non-breaching party's rights attributable to that breach unless the non-breaching party executes a specific, dated, written waiver.

The terms contained in this Agreement will remain in full force and effect during the following time period: January 1, 2020 through December 31, 2022.

Ordinance No. 20-2559

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 186 OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF BERGENFIELD, ENTITLED "LAND DEVELOPMENT"

WHEREAS, Chapter 186 of the Code of the Borough of Bergenfield sets forth all regulations regarding Land Development in the Borough of Bergenfield; and,

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Bergenfield, County of Bergen and State of New Jersey that those portions of the aforesaid set forth below are hereby amended as follows and that those portions of the Ordinance not set forth below shall remain unchanged.

Section 1

ARTICLE I, General Provisions, §186-3 Definitions is hereby amended to include the following terms in proper alphabetic order:

IMPERVIOUS SURFACE – (commonly known as Improved Lot Coverage).

A surface that has been covered with a layer of material so that it is highly resistant to infiltration by water. Examples of impervious surfaces include but are not limited to: brick pavers, crushed stone, gravel, paver blocks, porous paving, decks, patios, concrete, asphalt, driveways, basketball courts, swimming pools, buildings, elevated structures and other similar surfaces and/or improvements,

INFILTRATION- The process by which water seeps into the soil from precipitation.

Section 2

ARTICLE VI. Zoning Regulations and Establishment of Zones, §186-40 Regulations applicable to all zones is hereby amended by inserting the following provision:

M. The total amount of impervious coverage on any lot associated with any development shall not exceed the allowable limitation as set forth in Schedule B, except that to discourage the use of bituminous asphalt or concrete, an additional 10% increase in coverage is permitted when a property owner replaces existing bituminous asphalt or concrete surface with brick pavers. An additional 10% increase in coverage shall also be permitted for new construction. By way of illustration, if a property owner removes 800 square feet of bituminous asphalt, 840 square feet of brick pavers would be allowed as a replacement impervious surface. This bonus provision is not available when a property owner seeks to enlarge, expand or extend impervious coverage on a lot. In order for pavers to be deemed pervious coverage, the following provisions must be met:

- (a) an application must be submitted to the Zoning Officer with a new fully scaled survey in the name of the owner of the property. The survey must include the driveway, sidewalk, decks, sheds all setbacks. Lot coverage, improved lot coverage and proposed area to be covered with pervious, permeable or porous paver systems.
- (b) dependent upon the manufacturer of the paver system, an applicant may be required to submit with the application all criteria and specifications of the paver system. A credit will be given for pervious coverage based on the data of said manufacturer as each manufacturers allowable pervious percentage may be different. Each system will have an additional percentage of coverage as per manufacturer specifications. The total coverage must meet the Borough's bulk requirements.
 - (c) Silica sand shall not be utilized for the paver system.
- (d) A \$3,000 escrow will be required for the installation of a pervious, permeable or porous paver system for engineering and inspection fees. Said escrow shall be payable to the Borough and must be submitted with Form 9W. Any monies remaining in escrow upon completion and approval of the project will be returned to the owner.
- (e) The owner of the property is responsible to maintain the paver system to function as designed. Pervious paver systems must be inspected every five years. A permit and inspection are required to be performed by the Borough Engineer. Failure to maintain the integrity of the system and schedule required inspections will result in the issuance of a summons under the Property Maintenance Cody by the Department of Code Enforcement.
- (f) In the event of the sale of the home, the new property owner shall be responsible for the maintenance and integrity of the paver system and the scheduling of the required inspections.

Section 3

All Ordinances of the Borough of Bergenfield which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

Section 4

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

Section 5

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage, approval and publication as required by law.

ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK

(N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14)

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A: 4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget up to 2.5% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Bergenfield in the County of Bergen finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2020 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council hereby determines that a 1% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$295,274 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS the Mayor and Council hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Bergenfield, in the County of Bergen a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2020 budget year, the final appropriations of the Borough of Bergenfield shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14, be increased by 1%, amounting to \$295,274, and that the CY 2020 municipal budget for the Borough of Bergenfield be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

All matters with respect to said bonds not determined by this ordinance shall be determined by resolutions to be hereafter adopted.

Section 8. To finance said purposes, bond anticipation notes of said Borough of an aggregate principal amount not

exceeding \$3,800,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law in anticipation of the issuance of said bonds. In the event that bonds are issued pursuant to this ordinance, the aggregate amount of notes hereby authorized to be issued shall be reduced by an amount equal to the principal amount of the bonds so issued. If the aggregate amount of outstanding bonds and notes issued pursuant to this ordinance shall at any time exceed the sum first mentioned in this section, the moneys raised by the issuance of said bonds shall, to not less than the amount of such excess, be applied to the payment of such notes then outstanding.

Section 9. Each bond anticipation note issued pursuant to this ordinance shall be dated on or about the date of its issuance and shall be payable not more than one year from its date, shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law and may be renewed from time to time pursuant to and within limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law. Each of said bond anticipation notes shall be signed by the Mayor and by a financial officer and shall be under the seal of said Borough and attested by the Borough Clerk or Deputy Borough Clerk. Said officers are hereby authorized to execute said notes in such form as they may adopt in conformity The power to determine any matters with respect to said notes not determined by this ordinance and also the power to sell said notes, is hereby delegated to the Chief Financial Officer who is hereby authorized to sell said notes either at one time or from time to time in the manner provided by law.

Section 10. It is hereby determined and declared that the average period of usefulness of said purposes, according to their reasonable lives, taking into consideration the respective amounts of bonds or notes authorized for said purposes, is a period of 12.27 years computed from the date of said bonds.

Section 11. It is hereby determined and stated that the Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Borough Clerk of said Borough, and that such statement so filed shows that the gross debt of said Borough, as defined in Section 43 of the Local Bond Law, is increased by this ordinance by \$3,800,000 and that the issuance of the bonds and notes authorized by this ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

Section 12. Any funds received from private parties, the County of Bergen, the State of New Jersey or any of their agencies or any funds received from the United States of America or any of its agencies in aid of such purposes, shall be applied to the payment of the cost of such purposes, or, if bond anticipation notes have been issued, to the payment of the bond anticipation notes, and the amount of bonds authorized for such purposes shall be reduced accordingly.

Section 13. The Borough intends to issue the bonds or notes to finance the cost of the improvements described in Sections 1 and 4 of this bond ordinance. If the Borough incurs such costs prior to the issuance of the bonds or notes, the Borough hereby states its reasonable expectation to reimburse itself for such expenditures with the proceeds of such bonds or notes in the

maximum principal amount of bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance.

Section 14. The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this ordinance. Said obligations shall be direct, unlimited and general obligations of the Borough, and the Borough shall levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the Borough for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds and notes, without limitation as to rate or amount.

Section 15. The capital budget is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, is on file with the Borough Clerk and is available for public inspection.

Section 16. This ordinance shall take effect twenty days after the first publication thereof after final passage.

Health Officer's Report March 2020

Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19)

As of March 6, 2020, there are two confirmed cases of the disease in New Jersey. The New Jersey Department of Health latest guidance for monitoring asymptomatic individuals who have returned foreign countries with COVID-19 outbreaks now includes Italy, Iran, South Korea as well as China. Such returning travelers are being assessed at the international airports, and referred to local health departments either as high-risk, medium risk, or low risk categories depending upon the level of contact they may have had with a symptomatic confirmed case. We are also asking people who have been in contact with the locally confirmed cases, either from here in New Jersey, or in New York to self-monitor at home for the 14-day voluntary quarantine at home.

We will be moving forward on the development of "Continuity of Operations and Continuity of Government (COOP/COG) plans. A COOP identifies planning considerations for organizations in the performance of essential functions during a Pandemic.

Influenza 2020

According to the most recent New Jersey Department of Health Respiratory Virus Report available from the week ending February 22, 2020, influenza activity is "high" throughout the State. There have not been any more recent updates provided.

NJDOH guidance for coronavirus mitigation recommends those who did not get a flu vaccination to still get it, not only ward off late season flu disease, but to free up hospital beds from potential flu cases in case of a Coronavirus Pandemic.

Vaping

Local health departments are no longer investigating reported cases of vaping related Lung injury. To date there have been 59 confirmed cases and 49 probable cases reported in New Jersey. The number of cases reported since the fall of 2019 has declined significantly.

Board of Health training

Various types of training opportunities are available for Board of Health members to pursue continue education trainings, and to gain a better understanding of current Public Health topics.

The NJ Local Boards of Health Association (www.lbha.org) provides learning opportunities, including a Local Board of Health member Certification program. Successful completion of this program will allow Board members to use the initials, CBHM after their names. It is possible that certification may be mandated in the future.

February 2020 Public Health Nurse Supervisors Report:

Communicable Disease:

Active TB: None in Bergenfield have been reported to this nurse.

Latent TB: No residents were managed for medications to treat latent TB this month.

TST Skin Tests: Eleven residents requested screening for TB prior to employment or for school entry.

Laboratory Report Case Management: Please review attached list of disease follow up. Each resident is educated on prevention of disease transmission as needed.

Child Health Clinic: Dr. Nancy Rothenberg, DO examined ten children prior to vaccination. A total of 17 disease preventing vaccines were administered, along with one screen for TB and one for anemia. Each parent is advised on normal growth and development for their children's age.

School Age Child Vaccine Clinics: This nurse lead clinic vaccinated a total of eight children of school age with a total of 14 disease preventing vaccines.

Adult Vaccine Clinics: 16 residents requested disease preventing vaccinations. Total dispensed: 17.

VFC Applications have been sent to recertify our vaccine clinics this month.

Influenza Surveillance: New Jersey remains at high levels of influenza reporting. The predominant strain has been identified as B type.

Bloodborne Pathogen Hepatitis B vaccination clinics: Ongoing for employees and volunteers at risk.

School Immunization Audits: 6 initial audits were completed and 3 schools passed the audits on re visits.

WIC: A Regional Nutrition and Education program is held at the Bergenfield Health Department every 2 weeks. The Bergenfield Health Department nurse screens each family for anemia and to promote a healthy pregnancy. A total of 11 residents were seen and 7 anemia screens were obtained.

Adult Health Consultations: 27 residents were advised on health promotion by the public health nurses in Bergenfield. A weekly clinic is held at the Senior Health Consultation Rooms located at Brookside Gardens 293 Murry Hill Terrace.

Home Visits: Four residents have received home visits by a PHN as a follow up to police reports.

Other:

Application for Healthy Town 2019 has been submitted.

A wellness day was held on February 13th to assist Bergenfield workers to take good care of themselves. This was offered by Select Wellness of Westwood, NJ.

Continuing Education: Module 10 and 16 of the VFC and Adult Clinics has been completed by all Bergenfield nursing staff. 2 CEU's have been awarded each.

Mayors Weliness Challenge 2020: Continued meeting for planning the MWC have been ongoing. We plan on the kick off to be April 19th, 2020.

Interns: Bloomfield College and Rutgers University have sent nursing interns to assist with nursing programs.

This nurse attended the MRC training session in Hackensack. This month's topic was emergency management and patient positioning.

This nurse presented a class to Scout troop 139 of St John's Church on First Aid.

This nurse assisted with a Child Protection and Permanency investigation.
